TO APPROACH THE HALL — From Chester: proceed along the Farndon road (B5130) and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile beyond Churton fork left (signposted "*Worthenbury*"); after $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles cross the Farndon-Broxton road and $\frac{1}{2}$ mile beyond Shocklach bear right (signposted *Worthenbury, Threapwood*); a mile further fork left (signposted *Threapwood, Malpas*) and continue for $\frac{1}{2}$ mile to the Hall entrance drive on the right. In all about 14 miles.

From Wrexham: proceed via A525 to Bangor-on-Dee, cross the river bridge and bear left into B5069 and Worthenbury; at village centre turn right, bear left and fork right (signposted *B5069 Malpas*); at T-junction turn right and continue for 300 yards to entrance drive on right. In all about 8 miles.
